## 2012 High School Equestrian Athlete Grants

from the USEF High School Equestrian Athlete Program

Lexington, KY - In 2012 the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) will offer more than \$20,000 in grant money to qualified students and high school equestrian clubs or teams across the nation through its High School Equestrian Athlete program.

To be eligible for a grant an applicant must be a current USEF High School Equestrian Athlete program participant and have successfully completed at least one year of the program. The applicant must also be a member of at least one USEF Recognized Breed/Discipline Affiliate or International Affiliate Association. (See below for a list of affiliate organizations). A subcommittee of the National Affiliate Working Group will select one applicant from each Recognized Breed/Discipline Affiliate or International Affiliate Association to receive a \$1,000 grant to be used for academic or equestrian educational pursuits.

Students interested in applying for a grant will need to submit a 500 word essay that answers questions about their experiences in the USEF High School Equestrian Athlete program. Essay questions will be sent by email to all program participants in May and completed essays will be due between June 5th and 11th, 2012. All essays must be submitted through the applicant's online USEF user account to be

eligible for consideration by the selection committee. Additional information is available here.

The USEF will also award ten \$500 grants to local high school equestrian clubs and teams. These grants will be awarded to the ten clubs or teams in the USEF High School Equestrian Athlete program with the most student participation. State and national associations are not eligible to receive these grants.

# NDA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

#### **January 9, 2012**

Newly appointed president, Heidi Helmer, called the January meeting to order at Parker's Smokehouse at 6:30pm.

Board Members Present: Lisa Van Stratten, Amy Blum, Felice Rose, Heidi Helmer, Donna Michelson, Briana Beckworth, Tish Gade-Jones.

**Board Members Absent:** Casey Blum, Brian Duran. **NDA Members Present:** Diana Spaulding, Laureen Van Norman, Karin Nilsson.

The December meeting minutes were reviewed. Briana moved to approve the minutes; Felice seconded. Motion carried.

#### **REPORTS OF OFFICERS:**

**President:** Heidi Helmer reported that she had contacted Char Cole from Stillwaters Ranch in Hickman about holding a Western Dressage clinic. Char said she would be happy to do this. More information will follow.

Heidi also talked to Char about hosting a joint PonyClub/NDA sponsored educational event for junior riders. No word on this yet. More information will follow at the next board meeting.

Vice President: No report.

Treasurer: Diana Spaulding presented her last Treasurer's Report before turning everything over to Tish Gade-Jones. The Main Account Balance as of January 9 was \$12,849.15. The Show Account Balance was \$3,877.19. Amy moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; Donna seconded. Motion carried.

With the change in treasurers, there will also be a change in the people that have access to each account. Diana will change the Main Account so that Heidi and Tish will have joint access and will change the Show Account so that Heidi, Tish and Diana have joint access.

Secretary: No Report.

#### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

The Contact, March/April 2012

*Membership:* Sydney Ash reported that she added 6 new members to the roster. She also stated she had collected a total of \$290 in fees and sent \$150 to USDF for GMO fees.

Tish is pursuing offering NDA membership payments via on-line. She will come up with a form and will have more information at a future board meeting.

*Competitions:* Amy Blum reported that the Cornhusker Classic 2012 prize list is complete and has been sent for printing in the Region IV Omnibus.

Amy also asked the board if we wanted to make the Cornhusker Classic an AQHA sanctioned show. The cost would be \$50 for each show, totaling \$100 for the weekend. We

paid this last year and didn't have anyone take advantage of it. Lisa said that she had an email from Mala Erickson asking about AQHA points for the Classic. She will get more information regarding how many people would use it. We will make a decision based on her information at the February board meeting.

Awards: Laureen Van Norman and Karen Nilsson presented a list of changes/clarifications that the awards committee would like the board to vote on for 2012. The requested changes/clarifications are listed below with the board discussion after each one.

- 1. Should 3rd level and Western Dressage be added to the Schooling Show Medal Series? (after discussion, it was decided that Western Dressage would be added but 3rd level would not.)
- 2. Criteria for the year-end Western Dressage trophy needs to be set out and added to the handbook rules concerning year-end awards. (after discussion, it was decided that Western Dressage rules would be established by the board and competition committee. All changes will be added to the awards section in the handbook.)
- 3. There should be language added which permits electronic submission of scores for year-end awards. It was also suggested that a separate form for each award a competitor is applying for be submitted for easier computation of awards. (after discussion, it was agreed that the language would be changed regarding electronic submission. It was also agreed that the Awards Committee would come up with a new form for year-end awards and would present it to the board for approval.)
- 4. The Awards Committee asked that volunteer hours recorded at each NDA recognized schooling show or any NDA sponsored event be sent to NDA by the volunteer coordinator for each event. They also suggested that we have a spreadsheet of hours worked put on the NDA website so member's can check their hours before yearend awards are due. (After discussion, the board decided to make these changes. In addition, we created a Volunteer Liaison position to be filled by Lisa Van Stratten for 2012. After each show/event, the Volunteer Coordinator will submit the names of hours of each volunteer for that show/event to the Volunteer Liaison within 30 days of the show/event. These hours will be placed into a spreadsheet and posted on the NDA website. After each show/event, the spreadsheet will be updated and reposted on the website. It is the responsibility of each member volunteering to check this spreadsheet to make sure all hours are listed correctly. This will eliminate the need for members to fill out a volunteer form for year-end awards.) 5. What do we do with retired trophies? We currently

have a 4th level silver platter which is full. A new one

has been started but we need to do something with the old one. (It was decided that each retired trophy would be decided on a case-by-case basis by the board. The current retired 4th level trophy will be offered to the first winner of the trophy. If she does not want it, we will ask if we can display it at the Dressage Foundation's new office.) 6. The board needs to address the current high point trophies offered at the Cornhusker Classic. We have separate junior and adult high point trophies but there is no clarification if the winner can be an Open rider or AA rider. (It was decided to offer a 3rd high point trophy at the Cornhusker Classic. All winners must be NDA members riding Training-Grand Prix level tests. The trophy will be given to the Junior, AA and Open riders with the highest score from either day of the Cornhusker Classic.)

Communications: The Dressage Barns and Dressage Trainer pages on the NDA website need to be completed. Lisa will send out a mass email to all NDA members to get information on all trainers and barns in this area. This information will be sent to Amy Blum at amy@neb.rr.com to add to the website.

Publicity: No report.

Fund Raising: Heidi stated that she was working on the letters to send out for class sponsorship at the Cornhusker Classic. Lisa stated that the Dressage Foundation was interested in sponsoring a class. Heidi will make sure to include them in her mailing.

Equipment Management: A new lock is being purchased for the NDA trailer. All board members will have the combination.

Education: Karen Stricklett continues to work on the May symposium with Sarah Martin. Heidi, Amy and Felice visited the Alwardt's barn in Malcolm to check on the suitability for this event and future events. It was deemed an excellent venue by all. The Alwardt's agreed to host the symposium and Karen put together cost figures. The preliminary figures came in at total estimated costs of \$3,900.00 and total estimated income of \$3,985.00. She is checking over these figures and working on a grant from the Dressage Foundation. The board agreed that NDA would supply \$200.00 towards breakfast and beverages and will also supply insurance for the symposium. Karen will let us know about the DF grant and will get final costs to us at the next board meeting.

**OLD BUSINESS:** None.

NEW BUSINESS: Briana presented an idea for an NDA sponsored Yahoo Group for sharing horse related information. This group would be available to all horse lovers across all disciplines and would include NDA members and non-members. She will start the group and get information out via email, Facebook and the NDA website. The group will be called Horses of the Heartland and can also be found by searching Yahoo Groups.

The next board meeting will be February 13 at Breadeaux Pizza in Ashland.

ADJOURNMENT: Amy moved to adjourn the Board meeting; Briana seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:31pm.
