NDA SCHOOLING SHOW CHAMPIONSHIPS

The date and the venue have changed for the 2011 NDA Schooling Show Championships. Formerly held at Christensen Field in Fremont, this year's Championships will be held on September 24th at the Lancaster Event Center in Lincoln.

The increase in schooling shows this year has afforded members the many more opportunities to qualify for the Championships. There is still time to get those qualifying scores and compete at the Championships.

What are the requirements to qualify?

- The rider must be a member of NDA at the time scores are earned.
- The horse must be a member of NDA at the time scores are earned.
- The owner of the horse must be a member of NDA at the time scores are earned.
- A rider may compete on numerous horses, but each horse is limited to one rider.
- Horse/rider combination must have earned 2 qualifying scores at the same level from 2 different judges at two different NDA-recognized schooling shows.

NDA and Providence Farm to Host the
2011 USDF Region 4 Adult Clinic Featuring Lilo Fore

“The Classical System Simplified”

November 5-6, 2011 in Palmyra, Nebraska

Wanted: Riders age 22 and older of any ability. Horse may be at any level. Application deadline for riders is September 2, 2011 so start working on the requirements now! Clinic will run from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM both days.

Requirements: Rider must be a USDF member, obtain an instructor reference or history of instruction, create a video in VHS or DVD format, complete the entire application and ensure it is received by USDF by September 2nd. Cost for rider participants is \$250 for a 30-45 minute private session.

USDF will appoint a selection committee to review the applications and select 8 riders. The committee will attempt to select a broad range of horses and riders so that the auditors can see a broad range of issues that affect horses trained through the different levels. The committee will select horses of various breeds, including traditional and non-traditional dressage horses to ensure the auditor will see that classical dressage training methods will have a positive effect on any type of horse. The committee will select horses with training issues that might reasonably be encountered by the average auditor so that the auditors get the most benefit through watching the corrections and their effects.

So as you can see, everyone will have a chance at riding in this clinic. I hope you will take advantage of this great opportunity that has been given to our region.

Come to audit: Don't want to ride in the clinic? Then reserve your auditing spot now! Auditing is open to anyone at any age who desires more information on classical dressage training. Anyone who wants to further their dressage knowledge or just learn more about dressage will be welcome. Cost for USDF members who pre-register is \$40/day or \$70 for both days. After the October 21, 2011 registration deadline and same day walk-in cost is \$50/day or \$90 for both days. Non-members are also invited at the cost of \$50/day or \$90 for both days.

About the clinician: Lilo Fore is an FEI "I" Judge and began her judging career in 1974. In addition to judging, she owns a successful dressage training facility located in Santa Rosa, CA, and helped to develop the USDF Instructor Certification Program. Lilo's students have gone on to become successful professionals and horses bred by her have earned Grand Champion and Champion awards in breed shows in both the US and Canada. Throughout her career, Lilo has remained involved in many educational projects including hosting clinics all over the US and South America.

The 2012 Cornhusker Classic I & II tentative dates are May 18 & 19, 2012, at the Lancaster Event Center. The 2011 competitors appreciated the venue, and the Classic will continue to be held at this venue. The date may be changed, pending review by the Competition Committee. The show bill for the 2012 Classic will also be reviewed by the Competitions Committee.

Amy Blum stated that she would be retiring from the Competitions Committee. She expressed interest in apprenticing a replacement.

Western dressage will be held only at the schooling shows at this time.

The Competition Committee and Board will be actively seeking

a show secretary and judge for the Schooling Show Championships.

Fund Raising: A suggestion for an NDA recipe book was made. This may be a viable fundraiser.

NDA JR/YR MEMBER EXPERIENCE:

This past April, I had the wonderful opportunity to participate in a three day dressage clinic with Conrad Schumacher, the renowned former Olympic trainer for the Dutch and British teams. It was one of the most exciting opportunities of my life. At the age of 16, having ridden dressage only six years, I had never experienced anything like this before. From the time Jami offered me the opportunity, I could hardly concentrate on anything else. I ride a 10 year old sport Friesian named Auke that I have owned for a year and a half. He is very large, tends to carry his head high, and needs to be pushed by his rider. I was anxious for Conrad's advice on how to keep him through, attentive to my aids, and lifting through the shoulder.

I had always envisioned Conrad Schumacher to be a stern trainer of the German tradition, the kind who would bark out orders and tend to intimidate. In fact, I found him to be generous in his praise, extremely thoughtful in his advice, and encouraging gentleness in the rider. On the first day, he spent time getting a feel for my horse. He reminded me that I needed to take into consideration the qualities of my horse's breed when I ride. To do dressage, Auke would need to build strength in his neck and in his haunches, lower his head slightly, and develop muscles for collection.

After watching me ride only five or ten minutes, he had already assessed Auke's capabilities and knew what I needed to do. By the end of the first lesson, I found myself riding Auke in a completely new way, his head was down and there was noticeably more sway in his gaits. What's interesting about Conrad's style is its subtlety; his emphasis was in perfecting the basics. The entire second lesson focused on the downward transition, forwardness of his trot, and the suppleness of his neck. Each exercise seemed so simple, but putting them all together made such a beautiful result. This is what makes Conrad so masterful. The secret is in the simplicity of his method, sort of like a great chef.

By the third day of the clinic, Conrad began to try new exercises with Auke. He brought out the caval-

letti, and I took a deep breath. I had only used the cavalletti once before. These are low to the ground wooden poles over which the horse passes at the trot. When done successfully, the horse moves effortlessly over them in an even rhythm, off his forehand, with improved suspension and balance. Conrad used the exercise to get Auke much more forward and swinging in the back. Every exercise was tailored to exactly what my horse needed, making the whole process very worthwhile.

I was so nervous to work with someone of the experience of Conrad Schumacher, and what was most surprising about my interaction with him was how disarming he was in his generous manner. With all the Olympic level riders he has trained, he still recognizes that it isn't about all of the fancy tricks, but about the basics.

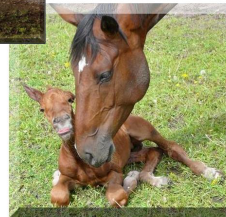

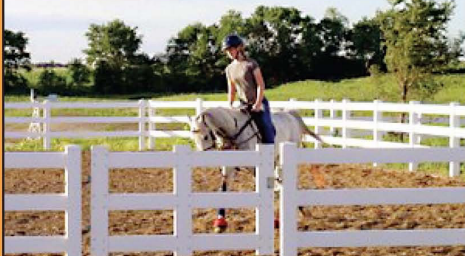

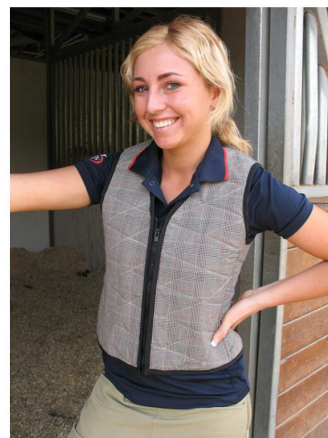
