From the President

It always makes me smile when I pick up my husband's copy of "The Western Horseman" magazine and find an article in which a guy (or gal) in a cowboy hat offers training tips that come right out of the dressage playbook.

I've never seen any of these western trainers give credit to Xenophon or de la Guérnière. Nor have I ever even seen any of them say, "Folks, it seems like those riders with the funny pants and the hornless saddles may be onto something."

And I'm reasonably certain that 95% of the magazine's readers have no idea that the guy in the chaps has (probably unknowingly) drawn his inspiration from a discipline that many in his audience have sniffed at as elitist or prissy.

There's just such an article in the June issue of the magazine. The trainer, who's a native Nebraskan, is concerned with "training your horse to be equally balanced on the left and right sides and when traveling in both directions."

Sound familiar?

He talks about flexions, the outside rein (although he doesn't say, or probably know, that that's what he's talking about), and a version of leg yielding.

Now, there is the occasional confusion—as when the trainer diagrams a horse in counter flexion and calls it "shoulder in," or when he suggests moving the horse laterally to the right by leaning waaaaaay to the left. And, as usual, when I was reading the article, I caught myself wishing I could send the trainer a book or a video or two and say, "Read/watch this."

But there's no question that dressage—the "foundation for all performance" after all—is seeping into the training methodologies of many people who are not even sure how to pronounce the word.

So if you come across a western rider who seems amenable to looking at horse training from a different perspective, be sure to ask him

or her to attend some of the functions sponsored by NDA, or even to join the organization.

It's a great way for people who are flirting with dressage to fall head over heels. And their horses will be eternally grateful!

New USEF Whip-Length Rule To Take Effect June 1, 2004

During its March meeting, the USEF Executive Committee approved rules changes that affect the length of whips that riders may use during recognized dressage competitions.

Effective June 1 of this year, only one whip no longer than 43.3" (110 centimeters), including lash, may be used in dressage classes and for warmup. (The previous whip-length limit was 48".) One standard longeing whip may be used only when longeing.

The change applies to classes at all levels—Introductory through Grand Prix.

During a six-month transition period, show officials and show management are being encouraged to help educate riders about the change by issuing warnings for noncompliant whips.

Be sure to check the length of your whip before the next competition!

Eleven-year-old Madison Nedved says she's been riding horses "forever." She started taking lessons at the age of five, and these days she is frequently seen at both Morgan shows and dressage competitions with her 17-year-old liver chestnut gelding, Connmigo.

"I like the shows the best," Madison says, "because it is so fun to meet new people. At the Morgan shows, I've met people from all over the USA. Now I have friends in Texas, Colorado, Oklahoma, California, and even Hawaii. I keep in touch with them through e-mail and a cell phone."

She credits her mom, Irene, with getting her interested in dressage. She and Connmigo—also known as Migoman, Amigo, and Connie—are currently riding Introductory Level, but they're anxious to move up to First Level.

Born in Seoul, Korea, Madison lives with her family at Galaxy Farm near Walton, which is where she rides and keeps Connmigo. She goes to school at Morley Elementary.

Connmigo is partial to apples, dressage, and being groomed. He dislikes walking through water—"but he will do it," Madison says. When they're looking for fun, they trail ride and sometimes participate in equestrian games.

During the last horse show they attended, Connmigo showed everyone that 17 years aren't enough to slow a Morgan down. "Connmigo is very gentle most of the time," Madison explains. "However, at the last show, he ran away with me on a race track. He ran as fast as he could. It was scary but exciting, too. I never thought he could run that fast."

"Unfortunately, we scared another horse and a girl was thrown and hurt. I feel very badly about that," Madison says.

This summer, Madison and Connmigo plan to go to lots of Morgan shows and also show dressage. When she's not in the saddle, Madison enjoys playing the violin and playing basketball."

All press releases regarding short-list selections and the final selection of the team will be posted in the Media Guide and in "Breaking News" as soon as they are announced. These releases will also be distributed to our email press list. Before and during the Olympic Games the USEF Media Guide will be constantly updated for news and results. Minutes NDA Board Meeting April 13, 2004

Present: Cynthia Johnson, Beth Wood, Loye Jaeger, Karen Stricklett, Monica Fitzwater, Mike Smith

Absent: Jane Fucinaro (excused), Jane Shanahan (excused)

Others in attendance: Linda Smith, Jody Brott

President Cynthia Johnson called the meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as printed.

Reports of Officers

President: NDA's insurance company requires NDA to have a release form to be signed by anyone participating in events sponsored by NDA. Cynthia drafted a release, which was read and adopted by the board.

Jody Brott, representing the Eastern Nebraska Driving Society (ENDS), suggested a ½-page ad exchange for their show program and our newsletter. Beth Wood moved to adopt the ad-exchange idea, Monica Fitzwater seconded. Motion carried.

Vice President: Beth Wood reported that the Cornhusker Pony Club (CPC) would have our Ride-A-Test Clinic poster in their show office to help NDA promote the upcoming educational event. The board agreed to allow CPC to have a table at the Cornhusker Classic where people could have their tack cleaned. The Board discussed the possibility of NDA doing a winter educational program on dressage for CPC.

Treasurer: Karen Stricklett reported that NDA has \$2,3651.59 in the main account, with a show-account balance of \$272.96. Work has begun on year-end taxes.

Reports of Committees

Competitions Committee: Monica Fitzwater, Competitions Committee chair, reported that all officials have been hired for the Cornhusker Classic and the Fall Festival. Some of the key volunteer positions have not yet been filled. Monica has confirmed arrangements for overnight security, on-site EMT, on-call veterinarian and the farrier for fall show. A farrier is still needed for the Classic. Recruitment efforts are still underway for scribes, gate stewards, and hospitality for judges and T.D.s. Monica reported that she will need to send Fremont Parks and Recreation a deposit of \$200 per show for 2004 to reserve the facility.

Education Committee: Cynthia Johnson read the Education Committee report, received from committee chair, Vicki Luther. Vicki has secured a \$500.00 Adult Education grant from Region IV for the upcoming Ride-A-Test Clinic. To break even, we need 24 2-day registrations or 48 one-day registrations. As of April 13, a total of 15 one-day registrations had been received with an additional five forthcoming. To promote the event, NDA members will be receiving fly-

ers, and the event will be advertised at the Shaggy Horse Dressage Show.

Terry Ciotti-Gallo, free-style clinician has purchased her airline tickets for the upcoming clinic. One registration has already been received.

Membership Committee: Heidi reported that the 2004 NDA Handbooks have been mailed out.

Publicity Committee: Cynthia Johnson has been working with Theresa Wagner to develop a listing of past *Contact* advertisers to contact for this year. The Board discussed promoting the Cornhusker Classic through the media.

Fundraising: Loye Jaeger presented the board with a listing of potential sponsors. Confirmation has been received from Reg and Wally's tack shop, and Lucky D's tack shop. Loye requested that each board member contact their respective stables and area businesses in order to expand fundraising activity. Cynthia Johnson said she would insert the fundraising rate card in the May *Contact*.

Unfinished Business

Location for Annual Meeting and Banquet: The Board agreed that the annual meeting should be located between Lincoln and Omaha in order to maximize attendance. Therefore, Beth Wood will contact the Ashland Country Club, Gear Jammers, Round the Bend and Prairie Oaks. Beth will report on her findings at the next board meeting.

Discussion of Mission- Statement Committee: Mike Smith distributed copies of a demographic profile of dressage riders received from USDF. Unfortunately, it does not have much detail. Mike suggested we approach Region IV Director Linda Landers to ask if the region would be interested in a project to gather demographic information specific to the region.

A meeting of the Mission-Statement Committee will be held at 6:30 p.m., April 27, at Gear Jammers. At the meeting, Mike hopes to define what we expect the committee to accomplish.

Discussion of Show Software Committee: The Board discussed the need to have a committee to "test" the Fox Village software to determine if it would be useful to NDA in running its own shows. It was decided that, because the software is the most commonly used, and because it is reasonably priced, there is no need to test it. Cynthia Johnson said she would contact the company to determine the number of computers on which the software can be installed.

Discussion of Insurance Rates: Karen Stricklett will review the insurance rates for the NDA trailer in order to determine whether a better rate can be obtained.

New Business

2005 dates of the Cornhusker Classic: The Board discussed the desirability of moving the dates of the Cornhusker Classic, starting in 2005, in order to avoid conflict with the College World Series. Following a lengthy discussion, Monica Fitzwater moved to establish May 20-22 as the 2005 dates. Mike Smith seconded the motion, which was carried.

Reports of Officers

President: Cynthia Johnson, president, said she has been notified that that SmartPak Equine is interested in sponsorships at horse shows.

Vice President: Beth Wood, vice-president, gave kudos to the Education Committee for the successful Ride-A-Test Clinic.

Treasurer: Karen Stricklett, treasurer, reported a balance in the main checking account of \$1,699.42. The show account has a balance of \$272.96. Outstanding bills include Blue Bridle insurance (\$204 for a balance due) and USDF (approximately \$400 for late-joining members). We will be receiving \$500 in grant funding from The Dressage Foundation for the Ride-A-Test clinic.

Reports of Committees

Competitions and Events Committee reports were postponed to New Business. There were no Education and Fundraising Committee reports.

Juniors: Jane Fucianaro reported that several juniors are interested in a commentary session with General Burton at the Cornhusker Classic. Monica Fitzwater said if we can make time for this during the show, she will. The juniors are also interested in attending the Walter Zettl clinic in July. Heidi Basler suggested that a group of juniors attend the North American Young Riders Championship in Chicago. Jane Fucianaro will organize a meeting of juniors at the Cornhusker Classic to discuss what they might like to do.

Membership Committee: Heidi Basler reported a total of 140 members: 2 Life members, 86 Individual Members, 24 Junior Members, 13 Family memberships, and 2 newsletter subscribers. We received two new members from the Shaggy Horse Show. Heidi will e-mail membership forms to the show organizers. Cynthia will take forms to the Wranglers show.

Unfinished Business

NDA Trailer: Kudos to Karen Stricklett for finding a home for the trailer at Pine Ridge. It is a good lo-

cation (between Omaha and Lincoln), and it is on a hard surface, so it is easy to access. Monica moved and Jane Shanahan seconded that NDA authorize the treasurer to pay Pine Ridge a \$10/month (\$120/year) fee for storing the trailer. Motion carried.

Karen is talking with Zimmer Insurance to find out what the trailer insurance covers. She will shop around for lower prices.

Location for Annual Meeting and Banquet: Beth Wood reported that the Gear Jammers restaurant fees would be about \$350, assuming we spent \$2,000 in food and drink that evening. Beth will also get prices from the Ashland Country Club.

Fox Village Show Management Software: Cynthia reported that the software costs \$299 to purchase, with a \$25/annual fee. The board agreed to postpone the decision on purchasing the software until the July meeting, when we will know if we can schedule the August show ourselves.

New Business

Schooling Show Medal Series: Awards Committee chair, Sandie McConnell, discussed the options suggested for calculating participation awards. Beth Wood moved and Monica Fitzwater seconded to establish a schooling show participation incentive award based on the number of NDA-recognized schooling shows attended. Motion carried.

Sandie reported that she has acquired the Captain Hiram Tuttle Senior High Point trophy. This traveling trophy is awarded at the Cornhusker Classic in memory of Capt. Tuttle of Ft. Riley, Kansas who won the Individual Bronze and Team Bronze in dressage at the 1932 Olympic Games. He was an influential in teaching Lowell Boomer and in the start of dressage in Nebraska. Beth moved and Heidi Basler seconded that the Hiram Tuttle Trophy continue to be awarded at the NDA Cornhusker Classic to the Senior (Adult) competitor who receives the highest score during the two-day competition, Introductory and Freestyle classes not included. Motion carried.

Sandie also reported that she has compiled the ribbon inventory and has 30 full sets for day one, 15 full sets for day two, and five sets for the schooling show. She will be able to save a lot of money by using these sets and just filling in the missing ribbons.

It was the consensus of the group that we allocate up to \$200 for championship prizes (12 awards). Karen Stricklett volunteered to call The Paddock.

Advertising in the Star City Sports June Issue: It was the consensus of the board that we not advertise because we don't have an advertising budget. Beth suggested that we send an invitation to non-members who compete in schooling shows, asking them to join NDA.

Illegal equipment at Schooling Shows: Because of reports that several competitors new to dressage were using illegal bits at the last schooling show, Cynthia will prepare a flyer, based on her article in the May *Contact*, and will include information on other illegal equipment such as draw reins. This will

Monica will find out if the Education Committee purchased a sound system that can be used for freestyle classes and announcements.

Other Business

Mike Smith announced that he has been appointed as the USDF Region IV Coordinator for "Large GMOs".

Meeting adjourned.

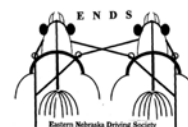
