Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the office fee. No refunds after the closing date.

Show Schedule: Ride times will be posted on the NDA website at www.nebraskadressage.org. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving ride times. When scheduling ride times, first priority is given to Championship entries. Complete Open entries will be scheduled in order of entries received. **Incomplete and post entry fees will be charged and must be paid before showing.**

Awards: Rosettes awarded through 6th place for Championship classes. Winners of the championship classes will receive a prize. Ribbons through 6th place awarded for all other classes. No high point awards. Mounted Awards Ceremony will be held for championship classes if scheduling permits. Times will be announced at the show.

Helmet & Horse Numbers: At all times when mounted, an ASTM-certified protective safety helmet with properly secured harness is required. The horse's number should be worn while schooling and during competition.

Attire: For classical dressage classes, a short riding coat of conservative color with tie, choker or stock tie is recommended. Breeches and tall boots or paddock boots with half chaps must be worn. Children ages 12 and under may wear jodhpurs and jodhpurs boots with straps – no leggings allowed. Gloves are recommended. No whips allowed for Championship classes. Championship classes must be ridden from memory. For Western Dressage classes, please refer to the current USEF/WDA A Western Dressage Rules for guidance on tack and attire. Helmet, horse number and whip rules above also apply to Western Dressage participants.

Vaccination records and voluntary temperature recording: Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent

with care and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of administration. 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on their letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management when requested. Other exhibitors are encouraged to take their horse's temperature daily.

Arenas: All performance arenas are indoors, footing composed of sand/clay, separate sand/dirt warm-up. Introductory classes may be ridden in a small arena (20m x 40m). Training tests 1 and 2 may be in a small arena. All other classes will be in a standard arena (20m x 60m). The arena will be in the FR8Star Pavilion (previously MPA). Warm-up will be in the Livestock Market Pavilion (previously Pavillion 3)

Stalls: Stalls will likely be in the Livestock Market Pavilion, so probably on dirt. Stall mats are available for \$30/stall and need to be ordered on the entry form in order to have them in your stall prior to arrival.

Directions: From the East: From I-80 West, take exit 409 for US Hwy 6 toward Waverly. Turn left onto Hwy 6 toward Lincoln for 2.7 miles. Turn left onto 84th St, continue for approximately 1 ½ miles. Turn left onto Havelock Ave or into

the Event Center from 84th St. From the West: From I-80 East, take exit 405 for 56th St/US Hwy 77. Turn right onto N 56th St, continue to Cornhusker Hwy (T-intersection). Turn left onto Cornhusker Hwy, continue over the bridge to 84th St. Turn right onto 84th St and continue approximately 1 ½ miles. Turn left onto Havelock Ave or into the Event Center from 84th St.

Other: Concessions: Available indoors on the grounds during show hours. Dogs: Dogs must be leashed and attached to a person at all times. Management may assess a fine if leash rule is not complied with.

Championship Classes: The highest scoring (60% minimum score) horse/rider in each championship class will be named Champion and second highest (60% minimum score) will be named Reserve Champion. Championship classes will count towards NDA year-end awards only but not next year's championship show. Western Dressage Level 3 and 4 Championship classes will only be offered when the judge is RWD.
