


A Look Back at the Classic



Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the office fee. No refunds after the closing date.

Show Schedule: Ride times will be posted on the NDA website at www.nebraskadressage.org. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving ride times. When scheduling ride times, first priority is given to Championship entries. Complete Open entries will be scheduled in order of entries received. **Incomplete and post entry fees will be charged and must be paid before showing.**

Awards: Rosettes awarded through 6th place for Championship classes. Winners of the championship classes will receive a prize. Ribbons through 6th place awarded for all other classes. No high point awards. Mounted Awards Ceremony will be held for championship classes if scheduling permits. Times will be announced at the show.

Helmet & Horse Numbers: At all times when mounted, an ASTM-certified protective safety helmet with properly secured harness is required for ALL riders. The horse's number should be worn while schooling and during competition.

Arenas: <u>All</u> performance arenas are indoors, footing composed of sand/clay, separate sand/dirt warm-up. Introductory classes may be ridden in a small arena (20m x 40m). Training tests 1 and 2 may be in a small arena. All other classes will be in a standard arena (20m x 60m).

Stalls: Stalls will likely be in Pavilion 4, so on concrete. Stall mats are available for \$30/stall and need to be ordered on the entry form in order to have them in your stall prior to arrival. Overflow stalls may be dirt or concrete.

Directions: From the East: From I-80 West, take exit 409 for US Hwy 6 toward Waverly. Turn left onto Hwy 6 toward Lincoln for 2.7 miles. Turn left onto 84th St, continue for approximately 1 ½ miles. Turn left onto Havelock Ave or into

the Event Center from 84th St. *From the West:* From I-80 East, take exit 405 for 56th St/US Hwy 77. Turn right onto N 56th St, continue to Cornhusker Hwy (T-intersection). Turn left onto Cornhusker Hwy, continue over the bridge to 84th St. Turn right onto 84th St and continue approximately 1 ½ miles. Turn left onto Havelock Ave or into the Event Center from 84th St.

Other: <u>Concessions:</u> Available indoors on the grounds during show hours. <u>Dogs:</u> Dogs must be leashed and attached to a person at all times. Management may assess a fine if leash rule is not complied with. <u>Tack and Attire:</u> See NDA Schooling Show Championship Rules at <u>www.nebraskadressage.org.</u>

Championship Classes: The highest scoring (60% minimum score) horse/rider in each championship class will be named Champion and second highest (60% minimum score) will be named Reserve Champion. Championship classes will count towards NDA year-end awards only but not next year's championship show. Qualifying rules for championship classes are at www.nebraskadressage.org.

Nebraska Dressage Association Guidelines for Western Dressage Awards

The Nebraska Dressage Association offers 2 award programs for members riding in Western Dressage classes.

To qualify for the Schooling Show Series Awards, you need to do the following:

- 1. Join NDA and register your horse in NDA before you first competition
- 2. Ride the minimum tests under at least 2 judges at your level of competition as outlined in the NDA Handbook. Include at least one Test 4 at your level in your reported scores.
- 3. Report your scores on time for Awards.

To qualify for the WDAA recognized show awards, you need to have the following:

- 1. Join NDA and register your horse in NDA before your first competition
- 2. Join WDAA and USEF.
- 3. Only scores from WDAA recognized show will count towards this awards program. They may be shows here in Nebraska and out-of-state shows.
- 4. Ride the minimum tests under at least 2 judges at your level of competition as outlined in the NDA Handbook. Include at least one Test 4 at your level in your reported scores.
- 5. Report your scores on time for Awards.

CHEAT SHEET for NDA AWARDS

Use this helpful form to keep track of what you have (and what you still need) for year-end awards.

Volunteer hours
(Rider must volunteer 6 hours of service at NDA-recognized events during the competition year.)
-OR-
Sponsorship/fundraising money
(Rider must raise \$60.00 in sponsorship money for NDA during the competition year.)
-OR-
Combination of above
(Rider may contribute a combination of service and sponsorship money, where 1 volunteer hour \$10 of sponsorship money, and total value must equal \$60.)
NDA Member
(Rider must be registered with NDA at the time scores are earned.)
Horse registered with NDA
(Horse must be registered with NDA at the time scores are earned and be at least 36 months old at the time ridden.)
Scores Needed
(For Intro–Fourth Level, a minimum of 4 scores at a given level. For FEI and Prix Caprilli, a minimum of 2 scores at a given level.)
Competitions Needed
(For horse awards, rider awards, freestyle awards, the David Funk Memorial Award, and the
FEI Jr/YR Award, scores must be from 2 different USDF-recognized competitions. For the

Swedish Warmbloods Award, and the Peter Rose Memorial Trophy, scores must be from 2 different NDA-recognized competitions .)
Judges Needed (Scores must be from 2 different judges.)
Minimum score (at each level) (To be eligible for horse awards, rider awards, and the schooling show medal series, you must earn a median score of 55% at that level .)
Highest test of the level (To be eligible for horse awards, rider awards, and the schooling show medal series, you must earn at least 1 score of 55% or above from the highest test of that level.)
*NDA Score Report form (You must submit ALL scores from ALL NDA-recognized and USDF-recognized shows from the competition year.)
